Students must have a total of 84 credit hours from a regionally accredited school prior to starting the program, otherwise they will not have the credits needed for a BSN.

The Registered Nurse to Bachelor of Science in Nursing (RN to BSN) program offering admits for fall and spring semesters with a part-time 15-month (four semesters), online distance format.

The basic program of study outlines the 36 credits; 21 credits plus 15 credits awarded through NURS 4121: Nursing Advancement Professional Portfolio course. In NURS 4121, you will be required to write a summary of academic achievement in each Bachelor of Science (BSN) program required course and elective courses. So, keep a copy from all the assignments you submitted in each course in this program. This course has a flat fee of \$500 instead of per credit tuition.
