Meet Alexa. After earning an associate's degree in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) at

Montgomery College in spring 2024, she set her sights on a nursing career. Scholarships, including the Longview ACES Pathway Scholarship, helped Alexa transfer to the Universities at Shady Grove (USG), where she's now pursuing her bachelor's degree in nursing—after which she will sit for the NCLEX licensing exam to become licensed as a registered nurse. This opportunity, and others like it, are made possible by generous donors like you.

Your support makes the difference. By contributing to the Transfer Scholarship Fund, you empower students like Alexa to achieve their dreams of earning a family-sustaining wage in high-demand fields. On average, MC awards \$3,821 per student seeking a Transfer Scholarship in Academic Year 2024.

Students like Alexa have access to additional scholarships that recognize academic merit, and address financial need. For instance, the University of Maryland offers competitive transfer merit scholarships that reward high-achieving students like Alexa to continue their studies without the heavy burden of tuition costs.

When Alexa landed on nursing as a career path, she knew MC was only the first step in her journey. Having the bachelor's degree will significantly affect her career path, giving her the opportunity both for expanded advancement opportunities in nursing and

often for higher earning potential. To fund this next phase of her education, she received the Board of Trustees Scholarship while at MC and the Longview ACES Pathway Scholarship, which carries over towards the pursuit of her bachelor's degree.
