GRAPHIC DESIGN TRANSFER PLANNING for UMD, SALISBURY and Other MD Transfer Institutions

The MC Graphic Arts A.A.S. 304A Associate of Applied Science provides a balanced foundation for immediate entry into the professional field; however, **students who intend to transfer to a university to study Graphic Design at the University of Maryland, Salisbury, Towson, or UMBC** are advised to follow either the MC <u>Art Area of Concentration, Arts and Sciences AA: 003</u> degree or the MC <u>General Studies HACL</u>. Work with an advisor to develop your transfer plan.

University of Maryland – College Park (UM) UM has three Tracks within the Studio Art major:

- <u>Track 1: B.A. in studio art.</u> This is an open program with no portfolio admission requirement. Areas of study: Painting and Drawing, Print Media, Sculpture, and Digital Media.
- Track 2: B.A. in studio art with an advanced specialization see UM Art website.
- Track 3: B.A. in studio art with a concentration in graphic design. This track is restricted to students admitted into the graphic design concentration through a competitive portfolio review. Students accepted into the graphic design program must complete a specific sequence of courses at both the 300 and 400 level. Graphic design courses are only available to students who have been admitted to the graphic design concentration.

COURSES THAT MUST BE COMPLETED BEFORE APPLYING TO THE UM GRAPHIC DESIGN

CONCENTRATION - Eligibility for the UM Concentration in Graphic Design: You must have a minimum overall GPA of 3.0. You must have completed (or currently be enrolled in) these art foundation courses:

- 1. ARTT100: Two-Dimensional Design Fundamentals = MC's ARTT 102 Introduction to 2-D Design
- 2. ARTT110: Elements of Drawing I = MC's ARTT 100 Introduction to Drawing
- 3. ARTT150: Intro. to Art Theory = MC ARTT 127 Art Appreciation (Art in Culture)
- 4. ARTT200: Three-Dimensional Art Fundamentals = MC's ARTT 103 Introduction to 3-D Design
- 5. ARTT210: Elements of Drawing II = ARTT 204 Intermediate Drawing or ARTT 205 Figure Drawing I and
- 6. ARTT255: Digital Art and Design Processes = MC's ARTT 116 Digital Tools for the Visual Arts

MC Majors recommended for transfer to UM's Studio Art, Graphic Design Concentration are:

- MC Art Associate of Arts 003 degree or the
- MC <u>General Studies HACL with Advising Notes for UM Art -Graphic Design</u> (Consider this alternate major for students who have some GDES courses or who need to take several World Language courses to fulfill the Global Engagement Requirement). **Discuss options with an advisor and consult with the UM Pre-Transfer Advisor.**

For ALL Studio Art Majors at UM (including the **Graphic Design Concentration**), students must complete the **Global Engagement Requirement.** This can be done before transfer by completing a single World Language through the Intermediate II level OR students may complete this requirement after transfer.

There are 3 options to complete the UM Arts & Humanities (ARHU) Global Engagement Requirement https://arhu.umd.edu/academicsadvising/global-engagement: 1) Complete a single World Language through a designated level; 2) study abroad (can only be fulfilled after transfer to UM); or 3) develop an independent experience arranged after transfer. Options 2 & 3 require demonstrated language proficiency through the elementary level of a single language.

These Montgomery College courses will complete the Global Engagement requirement: ASLP 100 & ASLP 110; CHIN 202; FREN 202, GERM 202, KORA 202, RUSS 202, SPAN 202 or 203. [UM's College of Arts & Humanities has confirmed that ASLP 110 American Sign Language ASL II as the highest level ASLP course needed to complete the

Global Engagement requirement, no further courses needed after transfer]. In addition to the above languages, students may also finish the elementary level of these languages at MC and then complete remaining levels at UM: ARAB, ITAL, JAPN, LATN, PORT.

Students with previous World Language knowledge (high school or native/heritage experience) may take a free Language Placement Test at Montgomery College to determine placement level.
